<b>ENG2D</b>	<b>10</b>	<b>English</b>	<b>English</b>	This course is a mandatory course for your academic track. You cannot opt out of enrollment in this course
<p>This course is designed to extend the range of oral communication, reading, writing, and media literacy skills that students need for success in their secondary school academic programs and in their daily lives. Students will analyse literary texts from contemporary and historical periods, interpret and evaluate informational and graphic texts, and create oral, written, and media texts in a variety of forms. An important focus will be on the selective use of strategies that contribute to effective communication. This course is intended to prepare students for the compulsory Grade 11 university or college preparation course.</p>				
<b>CGG3O</b>	<b>11</b>	<b>Canadian and World Studies</b>	<b>Geography</b>	This course is a mandatory course for your academic track. You cannot opt out of enrollment in this course
<p>This course focuses on travel and tourism as the vehicle for studying selected world regions. Using a variety of geotechnologies and inquiry and communication methods, students will conduct and present case studies that develop their understanding of the unique characteristics of selected world regions; the environmental, cultural, economic, and political factors that influence travel and tourism; and the impact of the travel industry on communities and environments around the world.</p>				
<b>BBI2O</b>	<b>10</b>	<b>Business Studies</b>	<b>Business Studies</b>	This course is a mandatory course for your academic track. You cannot opt out of enrollment in this course
<p>This course introduces students to the world of business. Students will develop an understanding of the functions of business, including accounting, marketing, information and communication technology, human resources, and production, and of the importance of ethics and social responsibility. This course builds a foundation for further studies in business and helps students develop the business knowledge and skills they will need in their everyday lives.</p>				
<b>BTT2O</b>	<b>10</b>	<b>Business Studies</b>	<b>Business Studies</b>	This course is a mandatory course for your academic track. You cannot opt out of enrollment in this course
<p>This course introduces students to information and communication technology in a business environment and builds a foundation of digital literacy skills necessary for success in a technologically driven society. Students will develop word processing, spreadsheet, database, desktop publishing, presentation software, and website design skills. Throughout the course, there is an emphasis on digital literacy, effective electronic research and communication skills, and current issues related to the impact of information and communication technology.</p>

ASM2O	10	The Arts	Media Arts	This course is a mandatory course for your academic track. You cannot opt out of enrollment in this course
<p>This course enables students to create media art works by exploring new media, emerging technologies such as digital animation, and a variety of traditional art forms such as film, photography, video, and visual arts. Students will acquire communications skills that are transferable beyond the media arts classroom and develop an understanding of responsible practices related to the creative process. Students will develop the skills necessary to create and interpret media art works</p>

MPM2D	10	Mathematics	Principles of Mathematics	I would like to be enrolled in this course (check one only) YES <input type="checkbox"/> NO <input type="checkbox"/>
<p>This course enables students to broaden their understanding of relationships and extend their problem-solving and algebraic skills through investigation, the effective use of technology, and abstract reasoning. Students will explore quadratic relations and their applications; solve and apply linear systems; verify properties of geometric figures using analytic geometry; and investigate the trigonometry of right and acute triangles. Students will reason mathematically and communicate their thinking as they solve multi-step problems.</p>

<p>This course is designed to help students strengthen essential reading and writing skills, providing them with the extra literacy support they need in order to graduate. Students will read informational, graphic, and literary texts, with a focus on locating information, identifying main ideas and supporting details, building vocabulary, and consolidating skills in the application of key comprehension strategies. The course will also help students develop core learning strategies.</p>

<p>This course explores what it means to be an informed, participating citizen in a democratic society. Students will learn about the elements of democracy in local, national, and global contexts, about political reactions to social change, and about political decision-making processes in Canada.
